
How to Set Your English Learning Goals in 6 Steps

Step 1
Your English Dream or your Lifetime English Goal

By the end of 2011, I will reach a high intermediate level of conversational English.



- 3. Learn new expressions that I can use in conversation



Step 4

Make Your Objectives S-M-A-R-T



Specific:

Your objectives should be well-defined and action-based. What exactly are you going to do? Use verbs like perform, discuss, summarize, debate, interview, role-play, use, explain or describe

Example: I will be able to define and use new English expressions in conversations with native speakers.

Measurable:

How will you know if you have reached your objectives? Use specific numbers in your objectives so that you can measure your performance later.

Example: I will be able to define and use 15 new English expressions in conversations with native speakers.

Attainable:

Is it possible to complete your objective within the time frame that you have set?

Your objective should be challenging but not impossible.

Relevant:

Will it be rewarding when you reach the objective?

Will your objective help you move forward in your professional or academic career?



Time Bound:

When will you accomplish your objective? Give yourself a deadline.

Example: I will be able to use 15 new English expressions after taking 7 private English classes.

Step 6 Your Action Plan for Reaching your Goals and Objectives

Now that you have your objectives on paper, you should ask yourself, "How am I going to accomplish my objectives and goals?"

We suggest you create an action plan. Your plan might include English lessons or a language exchange or maybe you will commit to joining an English conversation group or socializing with more native speakers. If you have an objective to improve your English for work, you could volunteer to lead the next business meeting or make a presentation in English.
